Description: The American Philosophical Society Library & Museum in Philadelphia invites applications for short-term residential research fellowships. These funding

opportunities provide 1- to 3- months of support for researchers in residence and are open to scholars in all fields who show a demonstrated need to use the Library & Museum's collections for their project. The APS Library & Museum collections make it among the premier institutions for documenting and exhibiting the history of the American Revolution and founding, the history of science from Newton to NASA, Native American languages and culture, and the development of American anthropology. A stipend of \$3,000 per month is awarded for a minimum of one month and a maximum of three months. Fellowships may be taken starting any day no earlier than June 1 and must be completed by May 31. Fellows are required to be in residence for four to twelve consecutive weeks, depending upon the length of the award. Applicants in any relevant field of scholarship may apply. Candidates who live 75 or more miles from Philadelphia receive some preference.
